

### **Bios**

Mabelle Reynoso - Mabelle Reynoso is a multidisciplinary storyteller and teaching artist who works in non-traditional theatre spaces, including classrooms, community centers, and correctional facilities. She is co-host of the podcast Hey Playwright and leads TuYo Theatre's Pa' Letras, a new play development workshop for emerging Latinx playwrights. She has a BFA from New York University, an MFA from the School of Visual Arts, and is currently pursuing her PhD in Education for Social Justice at the University of San Diego.

Mario Vega - Mario Vega is a playwright/lyricist/digital artist from Southern California. A graduate from San Diego State University, he has written the book and lyrics to three full length musicals during his undergrad on top of various short plays.

Denessa Cazares - Denessa Cazares is an actress and an award-winning playwright at the collegiate level. She has been in The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui (Dockdaisy, O'Casey, Betty Dullfoot); No Soy De Aqui Ni De Alla/ I Am Not From Here Nor From There (devised piece); She Kills Monsters (Agnes Evans); Everything Has Two Sides (Angel); Dear 2020 (devised piece); Fight Girl Battle World (Mikah Monoch); Twelfth Night (Malvolio/a). Her first play was her autobiographical ten-minute monologue There Are No Sunrises On This Side, which premiered at the City College New Play Festival 2021. It won first place in the district's Student Literary Competition for the League for Innovation in the drama category and it won second place internationally; her work will be published in the 2021 anthology of the organization. Denessa is a part of Pa'Letras, a play development workshop for emerging Latinx playwrights, she is honored to have her play Las Ganas De Morir debut at TuYo Theatre along with her peers' work.

Gabriela Flores - Gabriela Flores is a Chicana screenwriter and playwright, she has a Bachelors of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies of film, women studies and sociology from San Diego State University. Above all, she values kindness, authenticity, and creativity. Her pieces are centered around social justice issues like reproductive justice, immigrant rights, and sex education. She hopes that her work will help people find the shades of gray between many issues that divide us into groups of black and white.

Marielle Vizcarra - Marielle Vizcarra, a native of Calexico, CA, earned her Bachelor's degree in Communication and Theatre minor from UC San Diego in 2018. As a Senior in college, her first play, Not a Family Gathering, was produced by UCSD's Fair Play Theatre Company. That same year, she also played the role of Dorine during a modern production of Tartuffe. In April 2019, Marielle's play Diosito Lindo was produced by TuYo Theatre Company during their first show titled -UN. She has been a member of a playwrighting group called Pa' Letras since January 2021. Marielle identifies herself as a writer (poet/playwright) who occasionally enjoys acting and has recently taken up podcasting. She is fascinated by the family dynamic in Latinx households and enjoys portraying these stories in her work.

Mr. Rodriguez has studied on-camera performance with Robert Dahey, commedia dell'arte with Gale McNeeley, and most recently completed two years of the Meisner technique at Studio 4/Playhouse West in North Hollywood, California. A newly minted teaching artist with Playwrights Project, he devotes much of his time to the development of new work for stage, film, television, radio/podcast, and the interwebz at large. Along with friend and author David Vaughn, he wrote, directed and produced the irreverent madcap comedy The Cat Lady which saw its sold-out world premiere run at the Tenth Avenue Arts Center in the summer of 2017, and a year later, in collaboration with local artist Isaac Kalimo, wrote and directed the sexy ensemble one-act Okurrr (presented at the 2018 San Diego Fringe Festival under Michael Mizerany's Tabled Manners) which he is currently adapting into a short film.

She is more than excited to share these lovely projects with her friends and family and hope they enjoy it. 
### **Bios**

He has advocated for reform and funding on regional, national, and hemispheric levels, including serving as a steering committee member of the Latinx Theatre Commons, forging grants and awards opportunities for dramaturgs across Latin America, and founding a nonprofit for Latinx artists and audiences back home. Bernardo is an all around storyteller driven to create spaces where different peoples can intersect to listen, learn, labor, love, and play together.
